The Board of Water and Light (BWL) is excited to announce that we have entered the next phase of introducing plug-in electric vehicles and their infrastructure to our community.

The BWL received an overwhelming interest in our program from local residents and businesses. Our program participants have been selected and the BWL has begun to move forward with completing contracts with participants, receiving vehicles, installing charging infrastructure, and collecting data.

The Chevy Volts, one of the first plug-in electric vehicles to enter the market, have begun to arrive at dealerships in Michigan. One of Michigan's first was delivered to Bud Kouts Chevrolet in Lansing and picked up by J. Peter Lark, the BWL's General Manager on February 16, 2011.

Operating a plug-in electric vehicle means significantly reducing your carbon footprint with the added benefit of the cost of operating the vehicle averaging about \$1.20 a day - roughly the same cost as a household appliance.
