### MATERIALS DAY OF:

- A 10ft x 10ft tented area, two 8ft tables and one chair (no tablecloths)
- Chili sample cups (continually restocked as needed)
- Napkins (continually restocked as needed)
- Spoons (continually restocked as needed)
- Access to hot boxes (unless you're bringing your own)
- An identification sign for your business
- Hand-washing stations
- Food service gloves
- Electrical outlet
- 1 parking pass per vendor
- Vendor lanyard credential—up to 6 max

### **ADVERTISING:**

- A 30-second radio spot
- Posters and flyers
- An event program
- Press releases about the event
- Interviews with radio, television and print media
- Social media advertising
- Outdoor billboards

# **Registration Requirements**

- One copy of this signed agreement must be mailed to Chili Vendor Sign-Up, 505 E. Michigan Ave., Lansing, MI 48912 or <u>asees@lanisnglugnuts.com</u> and received by September 13.
- PLEASE NOTE: ALL participant-vendors in the 2019 Chili Cook-off must also enclose a \$100 deposit check with this agreement, made payable to Lansing Lugnuts. The deposit check will NOT be cashed and will be returned at the conclusion of the event, unless the participant fails to appear at the Chili Cook-off and/or does not clean up their booth at the end of the event.

# **Participant Requirements**

- The participant will provide a maximum of (6) six people to staff its chili booth from 4:30-9pm on Friday, October 4.
- The participant must have the booth set up and food delivered on site by 2pm for the Health Department inspection.
- The chili entry must pass a health inspection before the event, and a
  participant representative must attend a Health Department training
  meeting on Tuesday, October 1 from 2-4pm in the View at Cooley Law
  School Stadium.
- The participant will provide a <u>minimum</u> of **forty (40) total gallons of chili** to distribute to attendees between the hours of 4:30pm and 9pm. Please note that if you do not bring the required amount to the event, you will be charged a \$100 fee.
  - o Up to three (3) types of chili, equal to a total of **AT LEAST** 40 gallons
- Only two (2) types of chili may be entered for judging.

REMEMBER: Early sign up and payment allows you to pick where in the park your booth will be located AND your preferred load in time. This will be available on a first come, first served basis.

# **Frequently Asked Questions**

### Why should I participate?

It's a chance to invite all of your current customers and friends down to the ballpark to join you in a great time. Every year local television, radio and newspapers cover the event. It's great publicity for your organization, a chance to bring people together in downtown Lansing, support the community and have fun for the whole family.

#### What if chili isn't on our menu?

Not a problem! Nearly 50 percent of vendors don't regularly make chili.

#### Where and when is the Cook-off held?

The Chili Cook-off will be at Cooley Law School Stadium., 505 E. Michigan Ave. Lansing, MI 48912 on Friday, October 4.

### How does the Chili Cook-off Work?

The Chili Cook-off attracts thousands people annually, where "chiliheads" sample the area's best chili and salsas. Last year, more than 30 restaurants and organizations served up chili and salsas from their festive booths. Attendees enjoyed nearly 50 types to sample, plus two great bands for their listening pleasure. Other merchant-vendors offered ice cream, smoothies, beer tents, fully stocked bars and much more.

# Where does the money go?

All proceeds from the Chili Cook-off benefit the Lansing Promise/ H.O.P.E. Scholarship Program, Pennies for Power and Impression 5 Science Center.

### How many booth workers can I bring?

The standard number of workers per booth is six. If you require more, contact the team member for BWL Chili Cook-off on the first page of this packet to learn how to purchase additional tickets at a discount for your team.

# How much chili or salsa should I bring?

If you wish to be a chili vendor, the minimum amount is 40 gallons total.

### What awards are given at the event?

Participants compete for first and second place awards in the following categories:

Best Organization Chili
Hottest Chili\*
People's Choice Best Chili
Most Creative Chili Booth

Best First-Time Entrant Chili

\*Hottest and Meatless are the only categories you will have to notify us if you want to participate in for competition. You will automatically be entered in all of the remaining categories you are eligible for (Example: if you're a restaurant, you'll be automatically entered in Best Restaurant Chili)
