Why Does My Water Smell?

Have you ever noticed an unpleasant smell from your water? It may smell like rotten eggs, fish or earthy. While BWL water supply continues to meet or exceed all quality standards established by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE), here's some guidance to help determine what may be causing the stink.

Rotten Eggs, Decayed or Sewage-like - This smell is almost always associated with the water heater. Check to see if the smell is from the hot water only. If so, either replace the anode rod in your water heater or flush the water heater if it hasn't been used for an extended period.

Water Smell cont'd

Fishy – This smell is usually from the dishwasher or washing machine. Changing or cleaning the filter that catches the dirt and debris for dishes and clothing may be all that's needed to solve the problem. If that helps but doesn't completely fix the problem, a cleaning product approved for dishwashers or washing machines should help.

Musty, Moldy or Earthy – This most often comes from bacteria growing in the sink drain. Naturally it seems like the smell is coming from the water because you only smell it when you turn on the water. Fill a cup with cold water and walk away from the sink. If there is no smell in the cup, you need to disinfect the drain.
